Objective

This program aims to strengthen the public health workforce through increasing the number and diversity of Community Health Workers (CHWs) via a scholarship program

Why at St. Kate's?

- Many students who attend St. Kate's Community CHW certificate program and Public Health baccalaureate program come from underrepresented communities
- Significant number of public health students go on to work in underserved communities upon graduation
- In 2020-2021 academic year:
 - 40% of public health students were educationally/environmentally disadvantaged
 - 27% were economically disadvantaged
 - 25% underrepresented racial and ethnic minorities
 - This rises to 50% if Hmong and other disadvantaged Southeast Asian groups were included
- In 2022 St. Catherine University received a Health Resources & Services Administration (HRSA) grant to implement the CHW-ERP scholarship program to address these issues in health equity

Enhance the MN CHW curriculum to address emergency preparedness and response

Educate trainees to address social determinants of health in culturally and linguistically accessible ways






